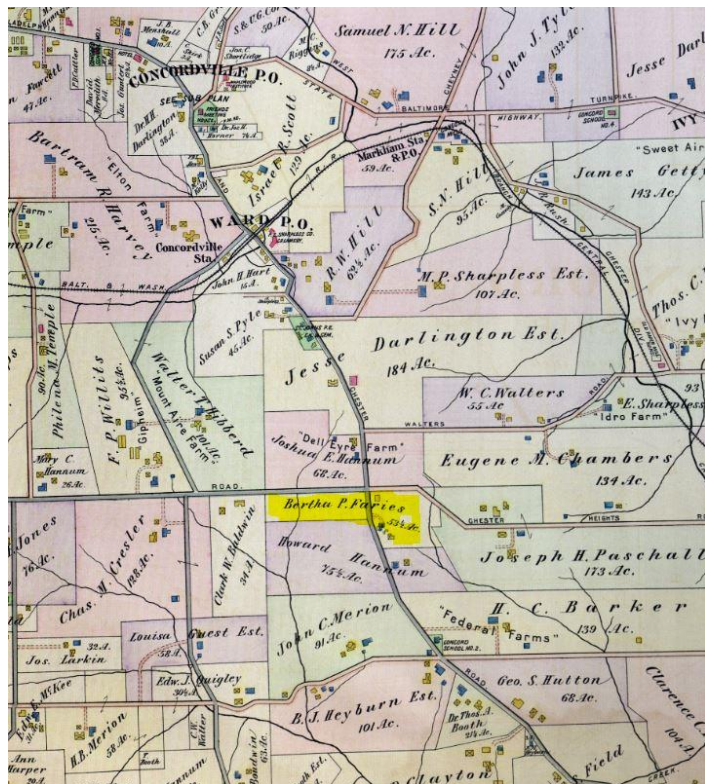

A BUSINESS CHANGE.

Extensive Establishment at Chester Heights Passes Into New Hands.

The extensive yards of John C. Rhodes & Company, dealers in lumber, feed, hardware, etc., at Chester Heights, passed into the possession of William Faries, of Smyrna, Del., and son, Gilbert S. Faries, of Concordville, Pa., this week. The property includes five acres of ground, a large warehouse with railroad siding, lumber sheds, lime house, blacksmith and wheel wright shops, a large residence with both stable and garage. The business will be conducted by the present owners until spring, at which time Gilbert S. Faries will assume control to be joined later by his father after he disposes of his Smyrna business.

JOHN C. RHODES DEAD

John C. Rhodes, lately a lumber merchant of Chester Heights, died early today at Jacksonville, Florida, whither he went early this week in the hope of benefiting his health. He has been a sufferer of heart disease for several years but appears to have become worse within the past few weeks. A telegram was received this morning by Harry W. Rhodes, of the Media Title and Trust Company, announcing the demise, the information being signed by Dr. M. P. Dickeson, who, with his wife and Mrs. Rhodes and Robert Howarth, Jr., of this city, compose the party.

Deceased was the son of the late William Rhodes and was a nephew of John B. Rhodes. He was a former county commissioner, a man of genial makeup and one who enjoyed the confidence and esteem of many friends.
